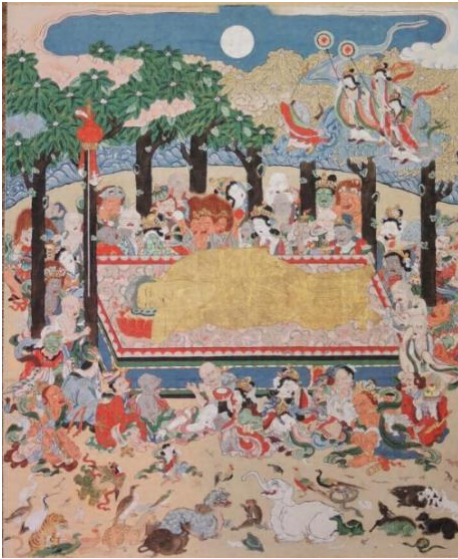

The Buddha's Final Teaching: Anuruddha's Insight and the Nirvana Scroll



February is the month of Nirvana Day, a time to commemorate the Buddha's passing into Nirvana. This sacred occasion invites us to reflect on the Buddha's final teachings and their enduring relevance. Depictions of the Buddha's final moments are beautifully portrayed in the Nirvana Scroll, which prominently features Anuruddha, one of the Buddha's closest disciples. His role in these scenes symbolizes mindfulness, insight, and the interconnectedness of all beings.

Anuruddha in the Nirvana Scroll

The Nirvana Scroll often depicts the Buddha lying serenely on his deathbed, surrounded by his disciples, followers, and even animals, all mourning his imminent passing. Among them, Anuruddha stands out for his calm and composed demeanor. With his deep spiritual insight, Anuruddha perceives the Buddha's peaceful state of mind and helps guide the grieving disciples by reminding them of the Buddha's teachings.

Anuruddha's presence in the Nirvana Scroll serves not only as a testament to his devotion but also as a reminder of his pivotal role in transmitting the Dharma. His insight into the impermanence of life and his understanding of Nirvana as the continuity of the Dharma emphasize the timeless nature of the Buddha's teachings.

Anuruddha's Exceptional Insight

Anuruddha was renowned for his extraordinary spiritual vision among the Buddha's disciples. As the Buddha approached his final moments, Anuruddha used his exceptional insight to discern the Buddha's serene state of mind. While others were overcome with grief, Anuruddha maintained his composure, providing strength to the sangha by explaining that the Buddha's passing was not an end but a transition, affirming the eternal nature of the Dharma.

President's Message for February 2025

Happy New Year! I hope everyone had a wonderful holiday season. It seems that we have had some unexpected changes at the church recently. At our last general meeting on January 7th there was a discussion of proposed monthly assessments for supporting the sharing of Rev. Majima with the other South Valley temples in the CCDC. The amount proposed represented a greater than 70% increase in what we were paying in 2024. The question came up on whether we should consider continuing to pay BCA dues but drop out of the Central Cal District and be an independent temple or a BCA Sangha or investigate into joining another district (which the Bishop will not support). A vote was taken on whether we should stay in the CCDC (if we can negotiate a compromise in the assessment) or leave the CCDC. By a narrow margin, it was voted to stay in the CCDC if I can negotiate a compromise on the assessment. It was predetermined that Barton Ashida would leave his leadership position if we were to continue on with the district. Barton has since formerly submitted a letter of resignation, after many years at the helm of the temple. The Fowler Buddhist Church is truly grateful for the many years of leadership

Barton has given for the betterment of the church.

The CCDC was to meet on January 11th for their meeting and installation. In a surprise move, it was voted that the CCDC return to the HUB system that includes all the CC temples including the Fresno Betsuin in sharing the two ministers, therefore prompting the need to recalculate the assessments all over again. On January 19th, immediately after the Hoonko Service, a general meeting was held to elect a new slate of officers for 2025. Voted into office were: Gary Mukai, president, Sharon Asakawa and Tayoko Honda, co-vice-presidents, Gay Mukai and Karen Mukai, co-secretaries, Barton Ashida and Ron Yoshimoto, co-treasurers, Gary Keithley, custodian of investment accounts. Craig Honda and I will be representatives to the CCMAC.

A CCMAC meeting was held on January 19th and new assessments were discussed but no agreement was reached. It was argued by Fowler that assessments should reflect minister usage, since Fowler has agreed to use the minister less than the other temples. New assessment schedules will be recalculated and will be determined at the next CCMAC meeting in February. In the mean time,

assessment will remain at 2024 levels until the end of March. Since the chairmanship of the CCMAC is a rotation among the participating temples, it was Fowler's turn to chair the committee, and by default, I will be chairman for 2025. I have submitted my own proposal for assessments which takes into account minister usage. A final vote is forthcoming.

Bishop Harada has hinted to start a monthly Buddhist education program for the district that he will sponsor, similar to the one that the bishop conducted several years ago. Fowler agreed to participate in taking their turn hosting a session as the hosting of classes will rotate. Details are yet to be determined, so I will keep you up to date on the start of the program.

As you probably have noticed, there are some structural repairs that are needed on the hondo building due to the church foundation settling on the northeast corner of the building causing multiple leaks and perceptible sloping of the floor. An assessment will soon be done and hopefully building repair work can get started. I will keep you posted on the progress of this project.

This month is our Nivana Day service with one of our favorite

guest speakers, Rev. Brian Nagata, so you won't want to miss it. I hope to see you all this Sunday, Feb 2nd.

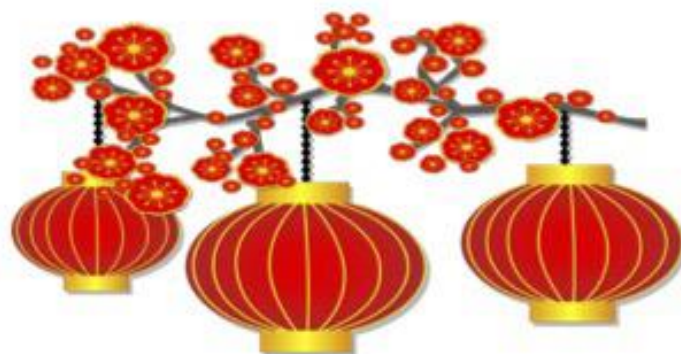

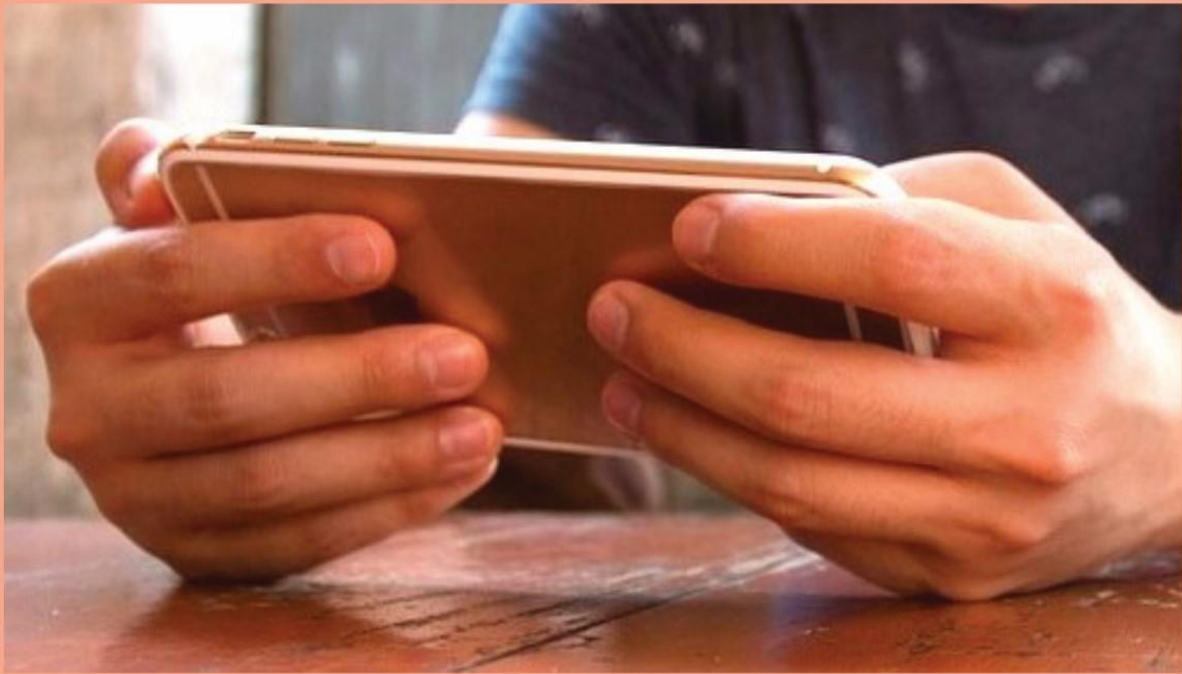

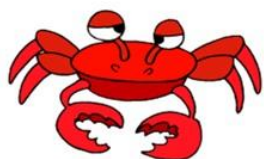
